2014 Allocations by Organization

ORGANIZATION	GRANT AWARD	PURPOSE
Center for Women's Justice	\$10,000	Intensify the impact of damage suits for <i>get</i> refusal by making them available to all Jewish women in Israel.
IT Works	\$10,000	Raise position of low-income and unemployed women in Yokneam by imparting technological and soft-skills training.
Jewish Agency for Israel	\$10,000	"Almah Derech Eretz" program, which offers low-income women an extended period of civic engagement before Israeli military service, as well as support after military service ends.
Jewish Interest Free Loan of Atlanta	\$7,500	Prevent Atlanta's single Jewish women in temporary financial crisis from losing their independence and capacity to fulfill their potential by providing loans and budgeting skills.
Kol Israel Haverim	\$6,500	"Cracking the Glass Ceiling," a program that advances young women to scholastic excellence with emphasis on science.
Orr Shalom	\$5,800	Support for a group home in Herzliya for adolescent girls who have suffered extreme abuse, violence, and neglect.
WEPOWER	\$5,000	"Women's Leadership Development in the Galilee," a project that nurtures, expands, and promotes social activism and social change with a gender lens.
Women's Courtyard	\$8,000	"Open Space Project," which promotes social justice, equal opportunities, and the right of every woman and girl to achieve self-fulfillment in accordance with her will.
Women's Spirit	\$10,000	"Standing their Ground" provides Israeli female victims of violence with tools to achieve self-reliance and become financially independent and integrate successfully into the job market.

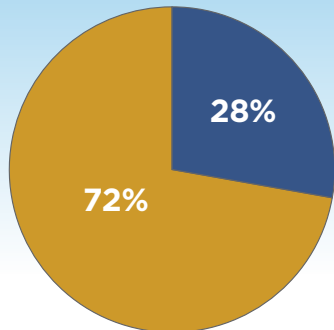

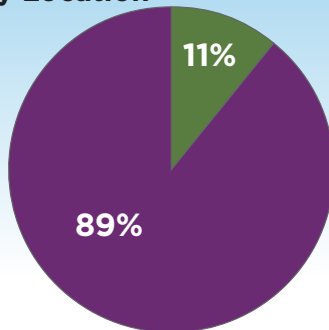
2014 Allocations

New vs. Renewal



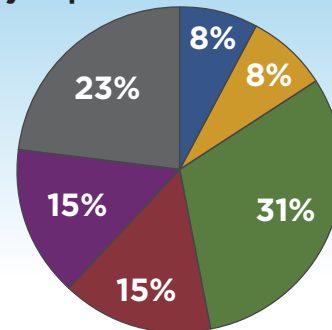
● New Grant ● Renewal Grant

SOCIAL CHANGE WITH A GENDER LENS

Social change philanthropy focuses on the **root causes** of problems, working to improve the conditions that lead to inequality. This approach is unlike traditional charity, which often seeks to address only the symptoms of societal problems.

JWFA seeks to promote change by addressing the underlying obstacles that impede the full participation of Jewish women and girls in society and by helping Jewish women and girls gain the tools they need to help themselves. As part of this mission, JWFA encourages the **active participation** of women and girls in the governance of organizations that it supports.

By using a gender lens, JWFA seeks to build on the needs, strengths, perspectives, and experiences of women and girls. A gender focus recognizes

that the needs of females may differ from those of males, and that we must pay deliberate attention to gender as an important component of diversity when creating, implementing, and evaluating programs. Gender-sensitive programs demonstrate an understanding of—and ability to meet—girls’ and women’s needs. Unlike many other funds, JWFA offers Trustees the unique opportunity to take a **hands-on approach** to grant-making. All Trustees have an equal vote in the grant-making process.
