2023-2024 was a landmark year for JWFA

Our response to **October 7th** was immediate and profound, sending financial support and emotional support to our Grantee Partners in Israel. We continue to remain in touch with our Grantee Partners in Israel who are working tirelessly on behalf of women and girls in the aftermath of October 7th. Along with the \$10,000 emergency grant we sent to JFNA within 24 hours of the attack, we continue to work along with sister organizations and our national organization, Jewish Women's Funding Network (JWFN), to raise awareness of the documented, gender-based violence perpetrated by Hamas against Israeli women and girls.

Our new local **Women's Leadership Grants**, piloted in partnership with The Zalik Foundation, have been an overwhelming success. We are excited to offer this grant opportunity going forward. The first group of nine Atlanta Jewish women professional grantees' learning and networking benefited themselves, their organizations and the entire Atlanta Jewish community. JWFA Trustees adopted a new **Strategic Plan** that will guide us for the next 5 years. We refined our **Vision Statement** - a world where all Jewish women and girls realize their full potential -and our **Mission Statement** - to invest in solutions that drive social change for Jewish women and girls. The plan sets our path for future growth in impact, Trusteeship, development, community building and partnerships.


